Timeline Aman's Case

JANUARY 2010-JULY 2012

Aman works for the Danish Forces in Helmand, Camp Price. In 2011 Aman's brother finds a threatening letter from Taliban, and Aman reports it to both the Afghan police and his Danish captain. Aman's cousin is killed by Taliban, he drove a truck with supplies for the ISAF-Forces together with Aman's brother.

AUGUST 2014

Aman has his first interviews with the Danish Task Force, his request for help is rejected.

FEBRUARY-MARCH 2015

New threats and new interviews with the Task Force. This time the Task Force recommends the Danish Immigration Service to issue a visa to Aman for his asylum assessment. The request is denied with reference to an alleged security risk.

AUGUST 2015

Aman has lived in a relatively safe place in Afghanistan, paid by the Danish authorities. The deal is terminated by the Danish authorities and he must find a new place by himself.

NOVEMBER 2015

Aman contacts Refugees Welcome. He wants to come to Denmark as he fears for his life. He investigates a many possibilities to get out with e.g. preferably with a visa, all are in vain.

NOVEMBER-DECEMBER 2017

Aman is forced to flee via Iran's mountains to Turkey after two masked men have asked for Aman at his dad's place and threatened him. He is forced to leave his wife and daughter with family.

APRIL 2018

Aman tries many times to cross the sea and get to Greece, but is arrested and sent back. He succeeds after 8-10 tries in July 2019.

OCTOBER 2019

Aman is released from a closed camp in Greece, Refugees Welcome tries to help him find an NGO that can provide him with housing.

NOVEMBER 2020

Aman is in Bosnia-Hercegovina where he has been pushed back several times after having tried to get to Italy and Croatia. The border police have taken his phone and his warm clothes, beaten him up and thrown him in cold water. He receives money for food from a Bosnian veteran he knows from Afghanistan.

DECEMBER 2020 - JANUARY 2021

Refugees Welcome sends Aman money for a new (used) phone to replace the one stolen by police. In January Aman sends a video of the camp he is currently living in going up in flames.
